Due to the COVID-19 pandemic discovered in Wuhan, China The researcher was able to formulate an Operating Room in December of 2019, the operating room has abruptly Model of Metamorphosis derived from the qualitative data transformed and coped with the new normal to accommodate the needs of continuing surgical procedures. The study sought to ascertain the changes that occurred in surgical case management practices prior to and during the pandemic, identify problems encountered in terms of safety, infection control, communication, and management, and develop a practice-based guideline based on the identified issues. This study utilized a concurrent triangulation mixed method design with a total population of 100 operating room nurses from private tertiary hospitals in Batangas. The quantitative data generated in this study through a self-report questionnaire suggests a statistically significant improvement in the practices in handling surgical cases before and during pandemics with a p-value of 0.000 in the pre-operative, intra-operative, and postoperative phases.

Model of Metamorphosis derived from the qualitative data analysis using thematic analysis, which can be utilized to further assess if there are changes in the protocols or guidelines that need to be facilitated in the unit to match with the phase of the current situation. Therefore, tailored-fit guidelines or protocols can be coined and applied guidelines appropriately to the operating room. With the synthesis of both quantitative and qualitative data, the researcher arrived at a recommended guideline to further improve the practices in handling surgical cases in this pandemic time and for sustainability that can be applied in the hospitals within the community.

The lessons that were learned from the COVID-19 pandemic will lead to new strategies for a substantial rearrangement of the routine in surgical practice, ensuring quality standards and preserving safety for both health workers and patients, thus embracing the new normal.



Operating Room Model of Metamorphosis

Stage Three: The Operating Room and its nurses strive to meet the standards that help them grow as impermeable pupa. This is where the hardening of the shield and the harnessing of protective minds by strictly advertigation to protocol happens.

Stage Four: Having surpassed the challenges through strategic actions, the operating room and its nurses finally evolved into strategic butterflies.

The Operating Room Model of Metamorphosis, derived from the results of qualitative data analysis, has been developed to assess the level of practices in the operating room. This can be utilized to further evaluate the existing protocols in the area to match the phase of the current situation. This model can be used as a decisionmaking tool during this pandemic period and if, in the future, the operating room might encounter another pandemic or epidemic.

In addition, the researcher has come up with a practicebased guideline using the Operating Room Metamorphosis Model and incorporating the results of the quantitative data analysis. Although the results show highly significant in all indicators for pre-operative, intra-operative, and postoperative, the researcher would like to focus on the items with the lowest scores for sustainability. The researcher strongly recommends consideration of the below alongside the existing protocols.

Healthcare in this time of pandemic must evolve to be able to render safe and quality service to the patients, and so the operating room, just like the biological process that occurs in an animal, results in a physical transformation through cell growth and differentiation, also known as

Stage One: At the beginning of the pandemic, operating room nurses can be compared to a vulnerable egg. With little knowledge of the virus they are facing, comes fear and anxiety. Supplies are not available; perioperative services are not ready.

Stage Two: Vulnerability triggered the operating room and its nurses to evolve into striving larva. This is where protocols and guidelines are created.

RECOMMENDED GUIDELINES IN HANDLING SURGICAL CASES

- Debriefing of staff by the end of the shift or post-shift huddle.
- One-on-one coaching or focused group discussion amongst the staff where they can voice out their emotions and feelings toward work.
- Individual counseling for staff as needed.







- Conduction of up-trainings with the latest updates in the policy and protocols, including return demonstration as necessary.
- Inclusion of transport personnel and housekeeping in the training for institutional protocols is essential.
- Re-evaluation of the existing policies and procedures for the staff on a regular

- All surgical team members are tested for COVID-19 prior to the surgical procedure.
- All members of the surgical team are screened for COVID-19 symptoms and exposure, including body temperature, prior to donning.
- Relatives or companions of the patient during hospitalization are tested for COVID-19 prior to entering the hospital premises.





ENT AND INFRASTRACTURES

- Use of negative pressure in the Operating Room is being observed every time there is an ongoing aerosolized procedure.
 When electrocautery is being used and available, a smoke evacuator is required.
- Fitting of masks and hazmat suits for the staff for everyday usage.

- Handing-off or endorsement of patients from the COVID-19 unit or ward to the perioperative unit is done via telephone.
- Any changes or updates in the policies or protocols are promptly cascaded to the staff.
- Inventory of PPEs is monitored strictly and the staff are made aware of any deficiencies and shortages.

Pursuant to Administrative Order No. 2020-0007 or "National Policy on Patient Safety in Health Facilities," all health facilities shall implement Patient Safety Strategies for key priority areas including Safe Surgical Care. DOH endorses the use of the following forms, as developed by the Philippine College of Surgeons (PCS), with roll-out done in cooperation with the periOperative Registered Nurses Association of the Philippines (ORNAP):

- 1. PCS Modified WHO Surgical Safety Checklist (Annex A)
- 2. Pre-Operative Huddle Checklist (Annex B)
- 3. Safety Officer Checklist (Annex C)
- 4. PCS Modified WHO Surgical Safety Checklist Monthly Report Form (Annex D)

The PCS Modified WHO Surgical Safety Checklist is based on the World Health Organization (WHO) Surgical Safety Checklist, previously endorsed in AO 2020-0007. All DOH Hospitals are thereby encouraged to utilize these forms with specifications on Infection Prevention and Control measures in surgical procedures. Facilities are also encouraged to consult their Infection Control Committee for further modifications to suit specific needs, relative to the COVID-19 Pandemic. 





According to the WHO, every year, millions of patients suffer injuries or die because of unsafe and poor-quality health care. Many medical practices and risks associated with health care are emerging as challenges for patient safety and contribute significantly to the burden of harm due to unsafe care. One of which is that unsafe surgical care procedures cause complications in up to 25% of patients. Almost 7 million surgical patients suffer significant complications annually, 1 million of whom die during or immediately following surgery.
